| <p>S 572 Service of notices and other documents.</p> <p>Any order, notice or other document required or authorised by this Act to be served on, or given to, any person may be served or given —</p> <p>(a) by delivering it to that person, or</p> <p>(b) by leaving it at his usual or last known place of residence, or</p> <p>(c) by sending it in a prepaid letter addressed to him at that place.</p> <p>But such a document may not be served or given in an electronic communication to a person as a parent unless —</p> <p>(a) the person consents in writing to the receipt of documents of the kind in question from the sender in an electronic communication sent to a specified number or address, and</p> <p>(b) the communication is sent to the number or address in question.</p> <p>(3) In subsection (2), “electronic communication” has the same meaning as in the Electronic Communications Act 2000.</p> | <p><b>S572 (4)</b></p> <p>(4) This section does not preclude any notice or order under sections 436H to 436O (which relate to school attendance orders in England) from being served by any other effective method.</p> |       |
